Our dedication extends to nurturing cultural safety for every child and young individual, encompassing those from First Nations, diverse cultural backgrounds, and those with disabilities. Queen Street ELC provides a secure and inclusive setting, embracing and celebrating the individuality of each child. Their inherent right to protection is resolute, and we are steadfast in our efforts to prevent any form of discriminatory practices.

Our approach is firmly grounded in continuous professional development, which empowers our staff to skillfully identify and address instances of abuse and neglect. Through their unwavering commitment to upholding child safety and responsiveness to their roles, our educators and staff assume a crucial position in this collaborative effort.

Aligned with the principles of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child, we educate children about their inherent right to safety. Equipped with knowledge about appropriate steps to take when feeling unsafe, children are actively encouraged to voice their thoughts on matters directly affecting them.

In our capacity as educators, we actively listen to and empower children to express any concerns they or their peers may have. This approach is deeply ingrained in our policies and procedures, underscoring our unwavering commitment to child safety.
